<p>Proportion</p> <p>Accurate facial proportions as learned in class:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Eyes are evenly spaced, with one eye width between them. • Nose is the width of one eye. • Corners of mouth align to the pupils of the eye. • Eyes are halfway down the face. • The nose is halfway between the eyes and bottom of the chin. • The lips are 1/3 of the way down from the nose (in the space between the nose and base of chin). • Ears begin at the eyes and end at the base of the nose. • Neck is not too thin. • Eyes are drawn in a way that shows knowledge of their anatomy. • Nose is drawn in a way that shows knowledge of its anatomy. • Lips are drawn in a way that shows knowledge of their anatomy, and don't look like generic "banana lips". • Ears are drawn in a way that shows knowledge of their anatomy. • Shoulders slope downward from the side of the neck and the neck does not curve to form the shoulders with one line. 	39		
<p>Shading/Color</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Evidence of a light source. • Face is shaded in a way that demonstrates knowledge of the facial planes. • Lips, nose and eyes are shaded to appear 3D and not flat. • Sides of the face look rounded/curved and not flat. • Hair is shaded with highlights and lowlights and does not appear stringy. • Student demonstrated proficiency with the colored pencil (including application of the material as well as blending). • A variety of tones are present throughout the portrait. • Warm and cool tones were used in the portrait to develop a realistic look to the face. • Local value of the face and its features are accurate/near accurate. 	45
